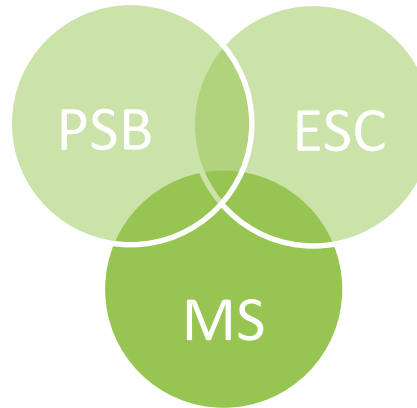

The **Political Strategic Board (PSB)** consists of representatives of the highest political levels in the partner regions and supports the network.

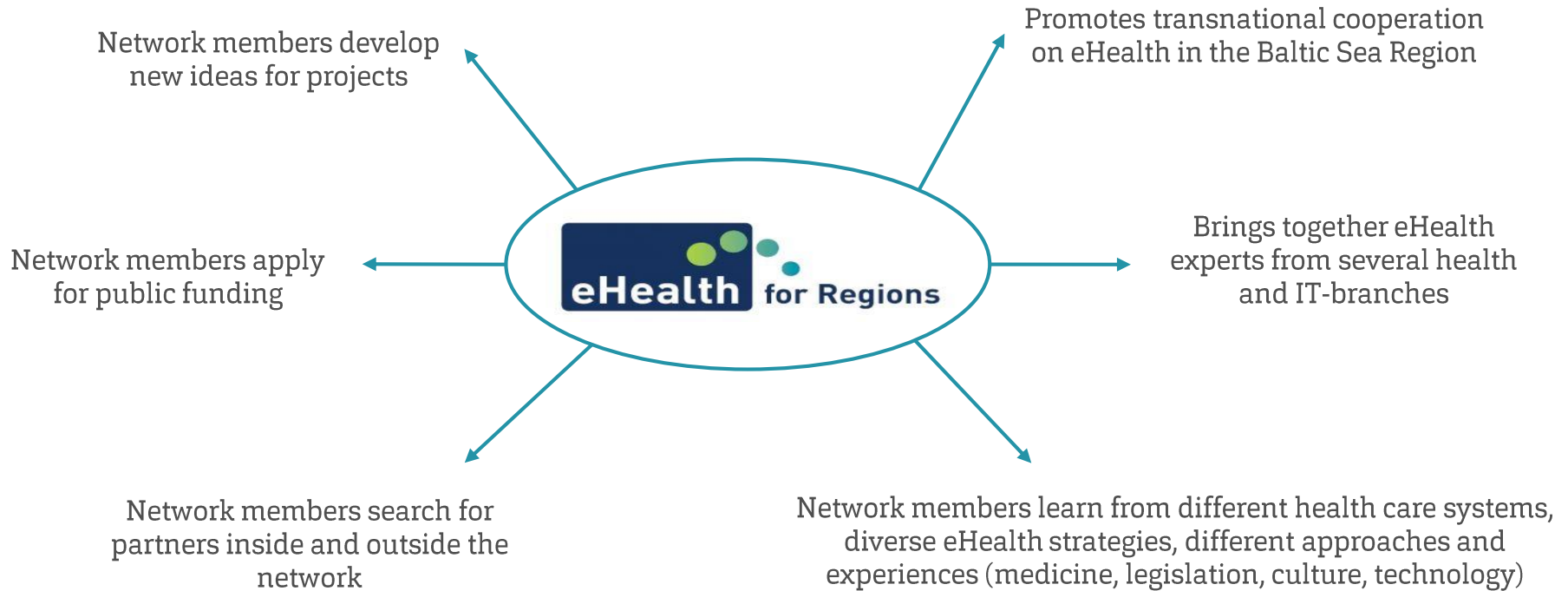
The **Executive Steering Committee (ESC)** develops a yearly activity plan, decides about the use of the budget of the network and prepares the decisions for the Political Strategic Board.



The **Management Secretariat (MS)** prepares the PSB and ESC meetings, organizes the network dissemination, maintains the network website, addresses new partners and promotes new projects. The MS is located at Flensburg University for Applied Sciences.

How we work



→ 2010 - 2012

The aim of this project is to improve acceptance of eHealth applications. Cooperation between patients, health care professionals, communities etc. allows a comprehensive strengthening of knowledge, skills and acceptance.



→ 2012 - 2014

This project aims to counteract brain drain and professional isolation of health professionals in remote primary health care through tele-consultation and tele-mentoring to strengthen social conditions in remote areas in the Baltic Sea Region.



→ 2017 - 2020

The aim of this project is to empower public health authorities to offer prevention and health promotion interventions that are effective and user-oriented. This will be achieved through a participatory, user-driven approach that ensures end-user integration from the beginning and involve eHealth.
